LEGAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

ACTIVITIES AND PROGRAMME IN 2018

<u>S T R U C T U R E</u>

The Legal Department occupies a strategic position in the Federal Ministry of Power, Works and Housing. The Works and Housing Sector has one Legal Department while the Power Sector has one Department. At the WorkS& Housing Sector, the Department is staffed with a Director, a Deputy Director and five Assistant Directors and a number of other Non-Directorate staff all totaling 21 Legal Officers. The Legal Officers are supported by eleven non Legal Staff. Together we carry out our mandate of providing legal advice of the Ministry and Defending the Ministry in Sundry Courts across the Country.

FUNCTIONS

CONTRACT AGREEMENTS

1(a) Preparing and executing Contract Agreements. All Contract Agreements for Contracts awarded, Development Lease, and Partnerships are carried out by the Department.

In the technical aspects of Contract Agreements, the Department has taken recourse to the line Departments by requesting expert imputs. The Department has in the last one year worked more closely with the Departments in this area. Please see Annex I. (b) Negotiation of Contract – Sometimes, the technical aspects of the Agreements become contentious. The Department mediates between the Department and the Contractor to close gaps.

(c) In the course of contracting the Department also vets Advance Payment Guarantees and Advance Performance Bonds to bring both in line with requirements.

LEGAL ADVICE

(2) Legal Advice to Departments of the Ministry. There is virtually no Department not requiring advice of the Department. Many of our activities in the Department you have heard mentioned by some Departments in their reports.

(3) <u>COMMITTEES</u>

The Department has been secretariat to many committees and the Director has chaired Committees on Petitions, investigations involving the Ministry and Other Parastatals of the Ministry. We need to build capacity in dispute resolution and negotiation to better serve the Ministry.

(4) <u>LITIGATION</u>

The Department handles all litigation relating to the Ministry. The case against the Ministry relate generally to non-payment for Contracts awarded in the Housing Sector and termination of Contracts and a few non-payment of contracts in the Works Sector. The Department has a list of 162 on-going cases between the Housing and Works Sectors.

In 2018 we had 15 new cases between the Works and Housing Sectors. See Annex I

In 2018 some 20 cases were either struck out, abandoned or became inactive. Details are contained in annexure attached.

In 2018 we commenced and concluded out of court settlements in 7 cases.

ARBITRATION MATTERS

In 2018 20 lawyers were trained in the first level Chartered Arbitrators training in Abuja. To qualify as Chartered Arbitrators and handle Arbitration matters for the Ministry they will need to go through levels 2 and 3 trainings. Currently a counsel appointed to handle Arbitration matters for the Ministry is paid between N15 Million and N20 Million naira. The full training will save costs for the Ministry.

In the Department we have 3 matters on Arbitration at the Regional Centre for Arbitration. The Ministry has paid Arbitration fees in one matter though it is yet to appoint a counsel to represent it. In the other 2 matters the Ministry has just initiated the process for appointing a counsel in one of the matters.

CASES FIRMED OUT

Government cases can be firmed out to Private Solicitors only with the consent of the Honourable Attorney General of the Federation.

In 2017 6 cases across the country were firmed out to external Solicitor.

In 2018 an additional 6 cases in different parts of the country are in the process of being firmed out to various external Solicitors. We have obtained consent of the Honourable Attorney General of the Federation to appoint a Counsel to the Arbitration matter against the Ministry. Please see annex II

JUDGMENT DEBTS

The Ministry is battling with judgment debts against the Ministry given between 2011 and 2017. We have managed to keep the debtors calm so that they do not apply for garnishee orders. We are trying hard to keep judgment debtors from embarrassing the Ministry. The Housing Sectors owes such debts to the tune of N1,453,186,083.07 Billion naira while the Works Sector has about N890,319,881.00 Totalling N2,343,505,964.07 for the two sectors. Luckily the 2018 budget made a little provision which we hope to use to quieten some of the impatient debtors. See Annex III.

<u>2019</u>

We shall continue to give legal advice, defend the Ministry in courts within Abuja and across the nation. We hope to build capacity of staff in Arbitration, Alternative Dispute Resolution, Negotiation and Conciliation. We shall acquire up to date law reports and commence E-Legal Library as funds permit. The procurement of a Utility vehicle is indispensable to the performance of our functions in the Ministry. We hope the 2019 budget will grant us that.
